THE MARCH MEETING

I am sure John did a first-class job of updating everyone on upcoming events including Drive It Day which he has once again kindly offered to organise. THE GROUP LEADERS MEETING

At the February meeting Jonathan presented a summary of the proposed changes to The TR Register. This also went out in the bulletin

A strategic plan has been put in place to make changes to the club as a whole so we can all move forward into the future. Some of the main points for discussion and up for change are: the brand, merchandising, club headquarters, the future for TS2 and the proposed new management structure.

There are 258 members in the Red Rose group so it was very disappointing to only receive feedback and views on the proposals from approximately 15% of the membership. However, Jonathan collated all the information and sent it to the chairman prior to the meeting.

The main things that arose from the day that will affect members are as follows

THE TR ACTION

The TR Action magazine is something that we all look forward to dropping on the door mat but did you ever think about the cost? It is a staggering 15K per edition to produce! I was shocked!

In order to bring costs down several changes are being proposed including only having 6 or 8 issues a year, dispensing with the social scene report to cut down on pages and having it at as a hard copy only

Wayne has also announced that he will be stepping down as editor in September but he will carry on with his other roles within the TR Register

TS2

TS2 was gifted to the register and as you all know it is the second car off the production line and the first RHD. We were given three option to discuss regarding what should happen to this iconic car

Should it go in a museum, have a partial restoration or a full restoration?

The consensus in the room was it should not go in a museum but that it does need to have some work carried out on it. However, it now needs to be decided how much work, by whom and at what cost. There are lots of ideas flying around from members completing the work to getting apprentices to do it at Gaydon Motor Museum. We will keep you updated as to any decisions regarding TS2 as soon as we have them

Jonathan is going to be asking for a full schedule of the works required and the approximate costs

THE NEW MANAGEMENT STRUCTURE

Again, this was something we were asked to discuss and provide feedback on

Points for discussion were:

Do we leave the geography as it is or do we change the number of groups a regional director would be responsible for?

How do we vote for the regional directors? Should this be done by the GL or by the members?

Should they be nominated or put themselves forward?

The management structure was also something we talked about and the proposed new roles

All our feed back was taken away to be discussed the following day but as yet we have not had an update on the outcome of this

RUNNING YOUR CLUB

We had a session to discuss how we run our clubs and we had a presentation on how we should be posting events on the website such as content and links to events

I would just like to take this opportunity on behalf of everyone at Red Rose to thank Phil Moss for all he has done for us updating the register with Red Rose events

Phil has a demanding job which involves being away from home so this may mean that sometimes you receive lots of email notifications at once but I am sure you can appreciate that he sometimes he has had to post numerous events on the same day due to time constraints

It was interesting to get ideas from other group leaders on how they run their groups and what they do at meetings but the consensus round the tables was that one size does not fit all and we should all do what we think works for our individual clubs and their members

DRIVE IT DAY SUNDAY 23RD April (a separate flyer has also been sent out)

This year John and Jane Leleu have very kindly offered to do a Drive It Day run and visit to Jodrell Bank. We will be meeting at Jodrell Bank telescope at 10.30 to explore the features and displays. Parking costs £4 in addition to entry to the site but if prepaid through web booking the ticket is valid for 12 months. Tickets for entry to Jodrell Bank are £12 for adults and £10 for concessions

BIG BOYS BREAKFAST, CLASSIC CAR RUN AND RED ROSE MEETING 11TH JUNE

Once again, we have decided to combine our June meeting with this very popular event and for the first time since 2019 the breakfast in the village hall is back!

If you haven't been before its well worth it! The day starts with the breakfast followed by a run and then a meet up back at the village hall. There is an option to have a pub lunch or to have a picnic back at the village hall on the grass where we will have an informal meeting

Following on from the last bulletin we have now received more information from the organisers

The format of the day will be as follows:

- Register with Susan at Antrobus Village Hall and collect your pre ordered breakfast tickets between 8 to 10am.
- Enjoy your breakfast and a look at the cars.
- The Run will leave between 10 and 10.30am. The run will as usual be about 60 miles and we know some of you take short cuts!
- The Run will pass through Kelsall towards the end and you are welcome to book your own table at The Morris Dancer there. This is a large Brunning and Price pub, in the same group as The Sutton Arms. We have visited the pub it has a large car park and is more open than The Sutton Arms. They can seat a large number of people inside and there are outside tables. But it is ESSENTIAL to book, which you can do online on their website. Sunday is their busiest day and if you do not book, they are unlikely to be able to accommodate you.
- If you do not want to buy lunch there, you can follow the instructions back to Antrobus and bring a picnic to enjoy on the field by the cars and the Village Hall. There will be toilets available but no indoor facilities in the event of inclement weather

This year we are raising funds for Antrobus Village's long-term support for a group of aid workers in Ukraine, personally known to a Village resident. Antrobus is holding a regular series of events to support them.

Driver on Run plus breakfast £12

Extra adult breakfast £9

Extra child breakfast £4.50

The run will take roughly **2.5 hrs**, depending on your speed and ability to follow the steps (!!), to reach **The Morris Dancer at Kelsall**. This is a large Brunning and Price pub, in the same group as The Sutton Arms. If you wish to stop for lunch there, details are below or you can simply follow the remaining instructions back to Antrobus Village Hall and picnic outside there.

We have visited the pub - it has a large car park and is more open than The Sutton Arms. They can seat a large number of people inside and there are outside tables. But it is ESSENTIAL to book, which you can do online on their website. Sunday is their busiest day and if you don't book, they are unlikely to be able to accommodate you. They tell us that they get booked up early, hence our writing to you now!

You will book using their online system, which will spread the bookings out over a period to give the kitchen enough time. So, you may wish to sprint and book at 12.30 or have a later start and more leisurely drive, perhaps stopping midway for a coffee, and take a later lunch booking.
