

## Solo Run to Spa

## June 2023 — Anthony 'Grafton' Beddoes



One Tuesday morning early in June wondering what to do, I thought about the Summer Classic coming up at Francorchamps, Spa. After consulting the boss (she had the bags packed before I got the laptop

out) I booked my accommodation and Eurotunnel ticket.

The next day I decided that going solo in the TR was a little adventurous so it was left in the garage thus it was the BMW that I took down to Folkestone and the Eurotunnel. However, in my rush to get away I had booked my ticket for the wrong day, I was a day



too early. Fair play to the voice at the other end of the intercom she booked me onto a later train that day, at no extra cost. So after a couple of hours delay I found myself just outside Dunkirk at my hotel for the night.



After a good nights' sleep I took off for Spa via a WW2 V2 Bunker site located at Watten, France. If you are into this sort of history it is worth a visit.

The bunker is enormous and was built to assemble, fuel and launch V2 rockets. Following repeated heavy bombing by Allied forces during Op-

eration Crossbow, the Germans were unable to complete the construction works and the complex never entered service.

It was captured by the Allies in September 1944, partially demolished on the orders of Winston



Churchill to prevent its reuse as a military base, and then abandoned. After this stop I continued on to my next hotel in Francorchamps which was situated only a few minutes' walk from the circuit.



and qualifying day so I ventured off to Bastogne to visit the Bastogne War Museum a very interesting place. This is where the US 101st Airborne Division held out against the Germans at the Battle of the Bulge. After this visit


I decide on a more scenic route back and what an amazing route that was. I must admit I did stop over at the track for a guick look.

and whilst he underwent radical surgery to remove the cancer unfortunately it spread to his lungs and he succumbed to it earlier this year.



#### Tue 24<sup>th</sup>
